The Great Rising of 1381



The Pulhams of Broxbourne

Claude Hitching has produced a book about the firm James Pulham of Broxbourne. This firm produced hard rock features for landscape gardens in Victorian and Edwardian times. To-day there are interesting Pulham gardens still in existence, many of which Claude has visited.
