A Guided Tour of Victorian Bengeo

Until the 19th Century, the land to the North of Hertford was still open countryside, while the village if Bengeo was little more than a hamlet clustered round St. Leonard's Church. By 1900, the area was covered in suburban housing and had been formally incorporated within the Borough.
